

The Life and Times of Emerald Snow Birds in Florida.

It seems that the Snow Birds of interest are still missing. As I drive around in areas frequented by snow birds, there is not one to be found, So, this month of November, I will digress from the task at hand and briefly describe what was required to catch rabbits in Ireland years ago. A dying art no doubt, but worth recalling for the benefit of future generations.

You see, when I was growing up in Ireland many years ago, money was a scarce commodity in the Farrell household but rabbits were very plentiful. The rabbit price was pretty good, it varied between one and sixpence and two shillings but the rabbits had to be caught and converted into money. Going into a dance hall or the pictures and slapping a rabbit or two on the table was not acceptable. A chap from Limerick would come around every Tuesday to a predetermined location, buy the rabbits and now you had shillings and pence that was accepted everywhere.

My main method of catching the rabbits was snaring them. That entailed setting a snare in the rabbit tracks and when the rabbit meandered along and encountered the snare, it choked him and hopefully he died. Then around five o'clock in the morning, I would go check my snares and collect my bounty.

Before setting any snares, they had to be made. The ingredients for making a snare consisted of copper wire, string, two pieces of wood, a pencil or two, a heavy pot lid. You had to measure out about four strands of wire, about eighteen to twenty-four inches in length looped together. You slipped one end through the handle of the pot lid and inserted a pencil, then the other pencil or a sliver of wood had to be inserted at the other end. Then holding the pencil, you spun the lid until the desired twist was reached. The next thing was to loop one end through the other end and attach a piece of string strong enough to hold a rabbit. That string was attached to a peg and inserted in the ground to hold the caught rabbit. The other piece of wood was used to set the snare at the desired height, it had a slit on top to set the snare into.

It was important that the loop be the correct size, so that just the rabbits head went through it. If the loop was too large, it meant that the rabbit was snared around the mid-section, did not get choked and was very much alive. Since rabbits are creatures of habit, they used the same track over and over again, Since, they hop along, there is usually a little mound between the hops. It is on top of the mound where the snare is set.

I need to convey a belated thanks to my father (RIP) for showing me and helping me make the snares. Since I had at least a hundred snares scattered around the various fields, in neighboring farms, it took a bit of time to get ready.

So, there you have it, now you know how to make snares to catch rabbits. If the snowbird activity is slow, please be prepared for other informative write ups in future months.
